Chi Che Wang (王季茝): Fast Facts

Era: 1894 - 1979

Nationality: Chinese

Science: Chemistry and nutrition

Known For: Considered the first Chinese woman faculty member in United States higher education



Performed laboratory demonstrations at the I925 Woman's World's Fair in Chicago

Assistant professor of physiology at Northwestern University, also worked for the Mayo Clinic and the Hines Veterans Administration Hospital





Wang (Chi Che) Park at I7I9 W Wolfram Street in Chicago is named after her

Chi Che Wang: Career Journey

Arrives in the United States, sponsored by a 1907 scholarship Chinese Exclusion Act still in effect, so there are very few Chinese women in the United States 1914- Graduates from Wellesley College, earns a Master's and PhD from the University of Chicago in chemistry **I918** and nutrition Thesis title: "Chemistry of Chinese Preserved Eggs and Chinese Edible Birds' Nests" 1915 Cofounds the Chicago Chinese Women's Club with Margaret H. D. Lin, the first woman medical doctor to graduate from the medical school of the University of Illinois T922 Elected as a member of the American Association for the Advancement of Science

- I925 Provides clinical laboratory demonstrations at the Woman's World's Fair in Chicago
- I93I Researches children's metabolism in Cincinnati, eventually returns to Chicago to work for the Northwestern Yeast Company
- 1943 Becomes assistant professor of physiology at Northwestern University Medical School

Visitors at the dedication ceremonies of the Children's Hospital Foundation, donated by William Cooper Proctor, were permitted to inspect the new building. In the top picture three investigators are shown working at respiratory apparatus. Air that has been exhaled is weighed and examined by means of the device pictured. Dr. Chi Che Wang, pediatrist and worker in the foundation, is seen at a machine which measures metabolism. Conditions under which food in the body is digested are approximated in the apparatus, so that metabolism under

varying conditions may be studied.

CHINESE GIRL JOINS WELLESLEY SORORITY

WELLESLEY, MASS., Oct. 18. Miss Chi Che Wang, of Socehow, China, has been elected to the Tau Zeta Epsilon Society at Wellesley College, being the first Chinese gin ever to enter an American secret so ciety.

She is accorded the privilege of wearing the pin and attains the liberty of the exclusive clubhouse of the society.

Tiny Chi Che Wang was seen hurrying into the business meeting Thursday morning. She came to the United States and entered Wellesley college on a fellowship granted by the Chinese government; received both master's and doctor's degrees at the University of Chicago, and is now a fellow in the Children's Hospital Pediatric Research Foundation, Cincinnati, Ohio. Unassuming Dr. Wang has recently been appointed assistant professor in biochemistry of the graduate school of the University of Cincinnati.
